### Breezeway Rules

In order to stay compliant with the Fire Marshall's code and regulations regarding combustible material in breezeways and blocking egress, we ask that you please refer to the rules below, thank you.

Plantation Buildings—Upper Levels: Nothing is to be allowed on the upper walkways of the Plantation Buildings. However residents are allowed to sit in chairs on the walkways, but as soon as the resident goes back inside, the chairs must be placed back inside the unit as well.

Plantation Buildings—Lower Levels: Each unit is to be allowed two (2) metal chairs and one (1) metal table, none of which can be placed in front of the fire extinguisher or fire alarm pull stations. No part of either table or chairs are to be constructed of any combustible materials. Any cushions used in chairs are to be kept inside when the tenant is not sitting in the chair.

Breezeways: Each unit would be allowed two (2) metal chairs and one (1) small metal table, none of which can be placed in front of either the fire extinguisher or fire alarm pull stations. No part of either table or chairs are to be constructed of any combustible material. Any cushions used in chairs must be kept inside when the tenant is not sitting in the chair.

### **Entire Property Stipulations:**

- 1. No flower pots
- 2. No Grills
- 3. No items to be hung underneath or from outdoor light fixtures.
- 4. No storing mops, brooms, toys, potting/gardening materials, empty pots or urns and shoes.
- 5. Breezeways are to be kept clear at all times.



### Ingredients:

- Milk (your preferred kind)
- Cocoa Powder
- Good Quality Dark Chocolate
- Cornstarch

#### Instructions:

- Add milk to slow cooker; whisk in cocoa powder and cook on HIGH for 2 hours
- Add in the dark chocolate and stir until melted. Taste for sweetness and add sugar if needed, whisk in a tablespoon at a time, taste and adjust accordingly.
- **3.** Prepare cornstarch slurry and mix it into the slow cooker.
- Cover the slow cooker and continue to cook for 1 hour, whisking occasionally to prevent lumps.
- When finished, ladle the hot chocolate into mugs, garnish with whipped cream and chocolate shavings (optional).
